### **ONSITE AED – AUTOMATED ELECTRONIC DEFIBULATOR**

Green Valley RV Resort is fortunate to have an AED onsite in the clubhouse available for use in the event of a cardiac-related health emergency. We are also blessed to have both resort residents as well as park personnel who have completed Red Cross training in its proper use. This training included current recommended CPR procedures as well as basic first aid skills. The AED is located on the wall outside of office's back door across from the card table area. The AED's purchase was funded by your Activity Committee.

In each of our park's newsletters, there is a list of these trained responders. We suggest you cut this list out and post it in your residence for quick access.

In the event of a cardiac-related medical emergency, immediately call 911 to get the ambulance rolling. Then contact a local park responder from this list to hopefully arrive quicker with our AED and begin lifesaving first aid while the ambulance is enroute.

Also please extend a sincere THANK YOU to these park responders for their willingness to assist in the event of a medical emergency.

We will have another class in AED training in January. This session will be taught by our local Santa Rita Fire Department personnel. Once training is complete, I will publish an updated responder list via Partyline.

## MAILROOM OPERATIONS

Mail delivery is a critical aspect of making your stay at the GVRV Resort a great experience. The following information is provided to facilitate communications between residents and Resort staff. If you want to receive mail during your stay, you must get a mailbox assigned to you. The office will issue you a mailbox & key corresponding to your lot number. There is a \$5.00 refundable deposit required for a mailbox key. Your mailing address at the GVRV Resort is (always use your name and lot number).

### Important Things to Know:

- Our mailboxes are small, so pick up your mail daily.
- Our mailroom is not a post office; we do not sell stamps or process packages for mailing.
- We do not hold packages for pickup by delivery service companies.
- Please let us know when you arrive in the park so we can open your box.
- If you intend to receive mail using an alias/business name, let us know! We go out of our way to get mail to its intended owner, but if we don't know who it belongs to, we will return it to sender.
- Let us know when you are traveling or leaving for the season. We will hold or forward your mail. It will also ensure that we have your correct forwarding address for your forwarding labels.
- Make sure you change your forwarding with the United States Postal Service (USPS). Just telling us to forward your mail does not change your status with the USPS. It's our policy to only forward first-class mail for 30 Days.
- We do not handle "postage due" mail. You will receive a notice from the USPS mail carrier and may have to go to the post office to pay and receive your mail.

### In-Coming Mail

The Green Valley Post Office delivers mail and packages in bulk to our mailroom between the hours of 11:30 AM and 3:00 PM six days a week. Staff sort and place your mail and package notification (green card) in individual boxes the same day mail is delivered. A bunch of flowers are placed outside on the north side of the clubhouse to let you know mail is sorted and ready for pick-up. Packages may be picked up from the office anytime during business hours; a green card is required for us to turn over the package to you.

Packages you order may be delivered directly to your lot by Amazon Prime, United Parcel Service (UPS), FedEx, and other private carriers, so be sure to use your current lot number to ensure proper delivery.

If you receive incorrect mail or have something for someone in the park, just drop these items into the "In-Park" mail slot located to the right of the mailboxes or turn them into the office.

Bulk coupons are placed in a rack hanging on the mailroom door.

### Out Going Mail

Outgoing mail is picked up by the USPS six days a week from the "blue" mailbox located outside the clubhouse north entrance per the schedule posted on the box.
