ONSITE AED – AUTOMATED ELECTRONIC DEFIBULATOR

Green Valley RV Resort is fortunate to have an AED onsite in the clubhouse available for use in the event of a cardiac-related health emergency. We are also blessed to have both resort residents as well as park personnel who have completed Red Cross training in its proper use. This training included current recommended CPR procedures as well as basic first aid skills. The AED is located on the wall outside of office's back door across from the card table area. The AED's purchase was funded by your Activity Committee. In each of our park's newsletters, there is a list of these trained responders. We suggest you cut this list out and post it in your residence (on your refrigerator is a great, highly visible spot) for quick access.

In the event of a cardiac-related medical emergency, immediately call 911 to get the ambulance rolling. Then contact a local park responder from this list to hopefully arrive quicker with our AED and begin lifesaving first aid while the ambulance is enroute.

We are very fortunate to have both the AED onsite and trained responders here in the park. Please familiarize yourself with who they are and who lives closest to your lot. Also please extend a sincere THANK YOU to these park responders for their willingness to assist in the event of a medical emergency.
